

Questions to ask to reflect on the wall

1. Assess the past. What can we celebrate? What do we need to grieve or let go?
2. Is there anything that needs to be confessed or made right? What are the problems the church has consistently faced we might want to notice and address?
3. As we stand before this wall (or poster), what is God saying to us that we need to listen to and receive?
4. What is God calling our church to do based on its past and what we can learn from this exercise?
5. Are there any hurts that need healing? Any sins that need to be forgiven? Any past resentments that need to be resolved?

Scriptures for group processing

2 Chronicles 7:14 "...if my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then will I hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and will heal their land."

Jeremiah 33:3 'Call to me and I will answer you and tell you great and unsearchable things you do not know.'

1 John 1:5-9 This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light; in him there is no darkness at all. If we claim to have fellowship with him yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live by the truth. But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin. If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. ⁹If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.
